Book Week

We will be holding our Book Week Parade on **Tuesday the 22nd of August at 9:15am**. Students are encouraged to dress up as a character from a book, and all things going well with the weather, we will hold this outside on the basketball courts. If the weather looks challenging with wind and rain, we will hold it in the hall.

I love our Book Week Parade. Every student gets their opportunity to walk down the runway and have a moment and share their love of fictional characters. We have a perfect size school to allow this to happen. It is always full of smiles and humour and often the unexpected. Built into our parade which we have developed over the previous years, is a parade of the local town area. We will do a lap of the block and parade down the main street. Welcome back © I hope the school holidays was a time of rest and relaxation for your families and that you are back happily into the swing of school routine.

This term we have some great feasts days with some truly inspirational Saints who have contributed to the life of the Church and wider society. However, of all the Saints coming up the one we need to spend some time reflecting on and thanking God for is St Mary of the Cross MacKillop. Her feast day is next Tuesday, August 8th. The one thing that amazes me is the vision she had and her commitment and tenacity to see it through. What started as one little country school in Penola had, within four years, grown to 127 Sisters that were teaching in 43 schools and managing four charitable institutions. From this many more schools and charitable institutions across Australia and even overseas were begun and the Sisters influence and work spread and made an impact on many people. When thinking about this, I can't help but think of the this passage from Matthew 13:31-32, "He put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." Our little school is part of the Josephite tree, part of God's Kingdom, where our students and family can come and make a 'home' here and for that, I'm very grateful to St Mary and the Sisters and their work. This quote from St Mary reminds me of her and how she did just this, but also an encouragement that God calls us out in love to be who He has made us to be. Love is willing the good of the other and so that is what He does for us, He wills the good for us too.

"Try to become all that the love of God wishes you to be" St Mary, 1868.

This term, the Year Three and Four class delve deeper into their understanding of migration and the highlights of the different cultures that have integrated and enhanced the Australian way of living!


Each Monday, we are enjoying cooking with Jo as part of our HASS studies. All produce used has been sourced from our amazing green space.

Student Write Up:


On Monday the 31st of July 2023, the year 3/4 class has been cooking with Chef Jo. The 3/4s have been cooking food from places around the world. On Monday the we made spaghetti Bolognese with fresh ingredients from our garden including tomato, capsicum, red onion and many other hidden vegetables in the sauce. The pasta was made from plain flour, water and salt. The final product was very delicious. First, we rolled out the dough that Jo had made earlier and put the pasta dough through the pasta machine. Then put it into a different setting. We put the pasta carefully onto the drying rack and let it hand while we cooked the sauce. First, put around 500gm of beef into a pot and start stirring, when it looks half cooked put in the tomato, pumpkin and capsicum in. Make sure that the pumpkin is grated and the capsicum is chopped. Finally, mash it up then add the rest of the ingredients to the sauce and stir it with a wooden spoon. After it looks ready, cook your pasta in boiling water and strain your pasta. When you have them both ready, grab some pasta, put it in a bowl and then grab some sauce and put it on the pasta. If you would like, add some grated cheese on top and grab a fork and dig in. We are seeking donations of meals to help those in need in our community.


